Exercise Faith in Jesus Christ

Read the principle of learning for this lesson aloud.

Jesus Christ can help me do all things as I exercise faith in Him.

One day, Jesus Christ was teaching thousands of people in the desert. Jesus and His disciples were worried because the people didn't bring any food. One boy in the group offered five loaves of bread and two fish to share. Many people wondered how only five loaves and two fish could feed all the people. But Jesus thanked God for the food, blessed it, divided it into baskets, and sent his disciples to share it. The Bible says:

Exercise Faith in Jesus Christ

Everyone ate, and there was extra food. It was a miracle. Similarly, you may feel like you don't have enough time to study English. Follow Jesus's example in this story. Thank God for what time and energy you have and ask Him to bless it. If you give what you can in faith, God can increase your capacity. Even if you have only a little time, perhaps you can study a few patterns or try to use a few new words each day. God can make your efforts more productive. Having faith in Jesus Christ and following His example can help you do more than you thought was possible.





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Activity 2: Create Your Own Sentences

Example



A: How much do your <u>apples</u> cost?

B: They cost three dollars. Do you want to buy these apples?

A: Yes, those apples are cheap.

B: How much do your <u>apples</u> cost?

A: My <u>apples</u> cost <u>five dollars</u>. Do you want to buy these <u>apples</u>?

B: No, those <u>apples</u> are expensive.









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Activity 3: Create Your Own Conversations

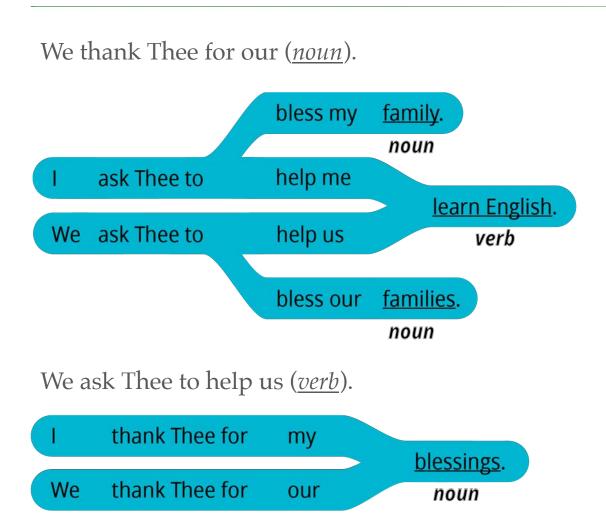
